16 Bridge Senior Steps to Priority Registration

VVC requires that these and the other Bridge steps must be completed before the granting of priority registration to Bridge students. Other K16 Bridge colleges modify this process to meet their specific needs.

Fall

Step 1: Looking at Me

Located: K16 Bridge My Mentor site under EUREKA Express.

Step 2: How Do I Learn

Step 3: World of Work and Me

Step 4: Personal Goals Survey

Located: K16 Bridge My Mentor site Below EUREKA.org

Step 5: Sign up for a FAFSA Pin Number - Optional

Use the link for FAFSA located under Apply to College. This link will take you directly to the Gov. site. DO NOT PAY to apply for either the pin number or the FAFSA app. Applying for FAFSA is free. There are sites that charge unsuspecting seniors.

Spring

Step 6: Apply for FAFSA- Optional.

Use the link FAFSA. Please list Victor Valley College as one of your colleges to receive information.

Step 7: Complete EUREKA. Org. sequence

- **True Colors**
- **MicroSkills**
- **Occ-u-sort**

Step 8: Look for other scholarship opportunities.

Go to EUREKA.org on your My Mentor site. Click on Financial Aid Guide. Locate Scholarships and click. Find one scholarship you would be eligible for.

Step 9: Apply to Victor Valley College

Even if you are not planning on attending VVC this is an opportunity to create a back-up-plan that comes with the benefit of priority registration.

Notes:

- Can apply for fall 2014 (Bridge only) starting Feb. 19th.
- Apply as a High School Graduate. Even though you won't graduate until later in the spring we need you to check the HS grad box.

Step 10: Receive VVC Welcome letter.

You will receive a Welcome e-mail with your VVC student ID number and further steps to enrollment Information.

Step 11: Watch Web Advisor video tutorials.

- Go to My Mentor
- Go to Student Tools and Links
- Scroll down to Quick Links to VVC
- Scroll down to Web Advisor- click
- On the Web Advisor page look to the top left hand corner.
- Click on Web advisor tutorials.

Watch all of the tutorials. You will use Web Advisor at VVC or a very similar program at other colleges.

- Create Web Advisor Account

Step 12: Connect to Data Pipeline

In order to provide you with college verified, up-to-date information on your process through matriculation we need you to connect to the new K16B Pipeline.

Step 13: Complete online orientation, including quiz.

- Go to My Mentor page
 - Go to Student Tools and Links- click
 - Scroll to the bottom to Quick Links to VVC- click
 - Scroll to the bottom of Quick Links to VVC to Orientation
- Note: you will need your VVC id number.

Step 14: Prepare for Accuplacer College Placement Exam

- See document below, "What does Accuplacer Score Mean?"
- Go to My Mentor
- Scroll down left hand column to Accuplacer (practice)

Step. 15: Take Accuplacer Exam at your high school**Step 16: Complete Preliminary Education Plan with counselor.**

Step 17: Participate in “Bridge Cares” event in May (TBA).

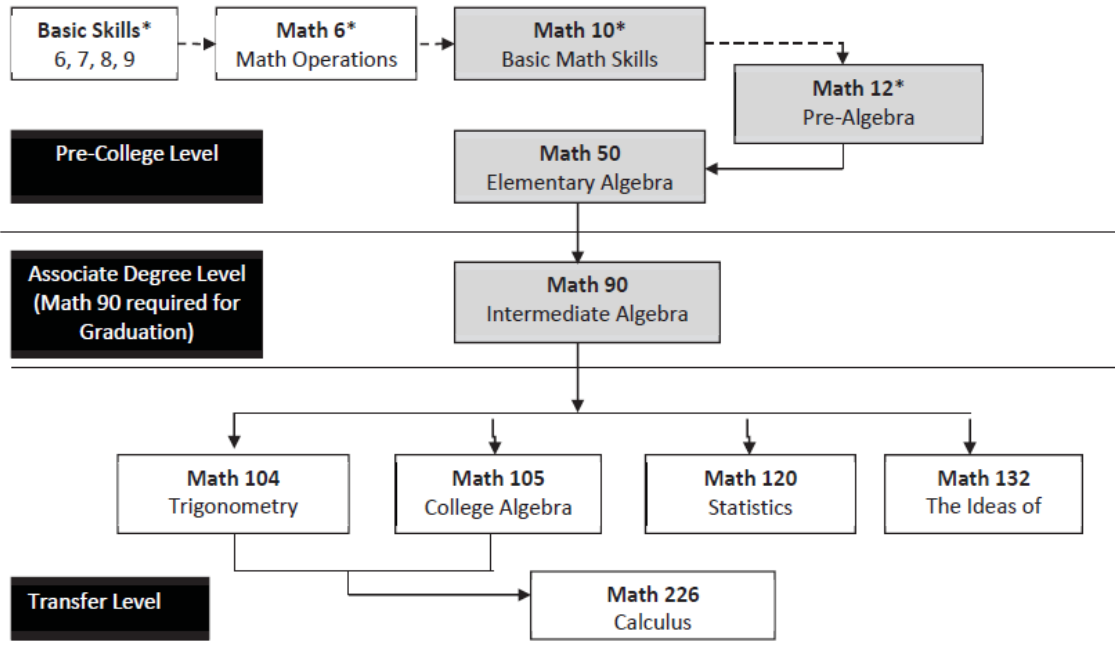
