

DRESS CODE

Education Code 35183 authorizes schools to adopt dress codes. Parents are asked to assist Silverado High School with enforcing the school's dress code by adhering to the guidelines below when shopping for clothes as well as checking students' attire BEFORE they leave for school.

The following items are **unacceptable** attire:

- A. Sandals with no back strap. Thongs, beach-type shoes, mules, slides or slippers are NOT ALLOWED.
- B. Headgear, headbands, visors, bandanas, nets, combs or picks in the hair and wave caps will not be worn. **Only hats & beanies adorned with the Silverado Logo will be permitted while on campus.**
- C. Hoods or hooded sweatshirts must be worn down except when outside in inclement weather.
- D. **Sagging is not** allowed. Accordingly baggy and oversized pants are not permissible. Pants must fit at the waist so that no undergarments are exposed. Belts are required for all pants and shorts with belt loops.
- E. The following shirts ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE: Sleeveless undershirts, strapless, spaghetti straps, off the shoulder, cut-out designs, sun dresses, low-cut or tight shirts, blouses or tops that bare the midsection at any time, bare-back, tube tops, male type athletic tank tops, mesh tops and see-through or sheer clothing that does not have an appropriate blouse or shirt underneath.
- F. Hemlines and slit dresses, skirts and shorts are not to be shorter than mid-thigh (measured by student placing arms and hands to side with skirt-shorts even or past their middle fingertips). Silverado logo gym shorts are permitted only in the physical education classes. No bathing/swimsuits, pajamas, nightshirts or slippers.
- G. Clothing and accessories that are unsafe and/or dangerous (heavy neck, wrist, wallet or watch chains, studded belts, metal belts, handcuffs, etc.) are UNACCEPTABLE.
- H. Items of clothing or jewelry which pose a threat of intimidation of the emotional and/or physical well being or safety of the student or others are unacceptable.
- I. Clothing, jewelry, paraphernalia, material or any manner of grooming which is obscene, sexually explicit, suggests sexually-related or obscene gestures, pictures or working which promotes violence, the use/abuse of drugs, tobacco, alcohol, or gang affiliation, or related weapons is UNACCEPTABLE.
- J. Clothing, jewelry, paraphernalia, materials tattoos or any manner of grooming that is gang related (as determined by administration) and/or symbols or lettering indicating gang affiliation is unacceptable.
- K. Partially worn shirts or sweatshirts over other clothing, pants rolled up on one leg, or pants/shirts worn inside out are UNACCEPTABLE.

California Education Code 48900 (k) - Disrupted school activities or otherwise **willfully defied the valid authority** of supervisors, teachers, administrators, school officials, or other school personnel **engaged in the performance of their duties.**

HABITUAL VIOLATOR STUDENTS **"MAY" BE SENT HOME TO CHANGE CLOTHES,** OR MAY BE REQUIRED TO WEAR **SCHOOL-ISSUED CLOTHING,** and/or **ASSIGNED DETENTION** FOR VIOLATIONS. STUDENTS WHO HABITUALLY VIOLATE THE DRESS STANDARDS "COULD BE" SUSPENDED FOR DEFIANCE.
